

Dear People of God,

I received a commentary on my discussion of the Eucharist from somebody who reads the bulletin but does not attend Mass or partake of the Body and Blood of Christ because "it does nothing for me, I feel nothing so it's meaningless." This attitude speaks to a general failure to understand the Eucharist and how or where it affects us. To perhaps make a point, I'll jot down a "secret prayer" the celebrant says just before reception of the Eucharist: May the Body of Christ preserve my soul to everlasting life.

Unfortunately, most Americans aren't in touch with their soul so do not feel the immediate and powerful effects of the Eucharist which bring the very person of Jesus into our being. To help people get in touch with their soul, the Universal Church is in the midst of a Eucharistic Renewal which is largely centered around the reserved Blessed Sacrament rather than the reception of Communion at Mass where far too many distractions may prevent getting in touch with the soul. The Church highly recommends taking a Holy Hour to just be quiet in the presence of the Eucharist. This used to be fairly easy since nobody locked doors and lots of people did stop in at the church just to sit quietly and pray a bit, or just listen to God. Most parishes had regularly scheduled times when the Blessed Sacrament was set out for veneration and Forty Hours was "must" at every parish.

Today our churches must be locked most of the time to prevent vandalism and theft, which is itself a sad commentary on the evolution of our culture. As a result the good habits of the past which led people to church have disappeared and nothing has been put in their place. Most Americans have developed other behavioral habits which do not include time for visiting church!

The distractions of contemporary culture also tend to diminish a sense of the spiritual so staying in touch with the soul recedes farther and farther into the foggy part of our lives. Recapturing that essential human conversation with the interior self is difficult and demands far more energy than many Americans are willing to exert. Rather than mend the wound, we default to our new habits: shopping television, texting, fantasy sports, and the list goes on. None of these is good for the soul.

Eucharistic renewal seeks to provide opportunity to regain a sense of the mystery of Jesus' presence rather than the glitz and glamour modern culture expects from any VIP paying a call. Jesus isn't a rock star and never will be so how he reacts within the soul isn't going to set off all kinds of bells and whistles – that presence is deep within, a spiritual union which enriches the soul, empowers that soul to action and fills it with the sense of God's love truly there

All of us should expect that the mind and body will also come to feel that divine presence, but that won't happen until we share at the eternal table of Christ in the Kingdom. Our sense of presence now is in the soul and it's there that we ought to turn to feel Jesus one with us. That can best happen in the quiet of a few minutes after Mass reflecting on the Eucharist we went up to receive, or taking time to visit the church when the doors are open for Eucharistic Adoration.

The person who stated that the Eucharist is meaningless needs only to find the portal to the spirit within and then the Eucharist will make a world of difference.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Health News for Health News for August 11, 2024

Snoring: Causes. When you sleep, the muscles in your throat relax and your tongue slips back in your mouth. Snoring occurs when something blocks air from flowing freely through your mouth and nose. When you breathe, the walls of your throat vibrate, causing the sound of snoring. There are several factors that can lead to snoring, including:

Being overweight. The extra tissue in your neck puts pressure on your airways.

Tissue swelling during the last month of pregnancy.

Crooked or bent nasal septum, which is the wall of bone and cartilage between your nostrils. Growths in your nasal passages (nasal polyps).

Stuffy nose from a cold or allergies.

Swelling in the roof of your mouth (soft palate) or the uvula, the piece of tissue that hangs down in the back of your mouth. These areas may also be longer than normal.

Swollen adenoids and tonsils that block the airways. This is a common cause of snoring in children.

A tongue that is wider at the base, or a larger tongue in a smaller mouth.

Poor muscle tone. This may be caused by aging or by using sleeping pills, antihistamines, or alcohol at bedtime.
