

Dear People of God,

Today the parish celebrates firefighters and other first responders at Mass, giving thanks for those who join us and praying that all who are involved in protecting lives and property will be kept safe.

Perhaps the patron of firefighters is an unknown to many, so allow me to briefly share the story of St. Florian, Patron of Firefighters.

Florian von Lorch was born in the middle of the third century after Christ, a period of both rapid advancement of Christianity and harsh reprisals against Christians. Like many a young man he aspired to a career in the Roman army and showed genuine leadership qualities which led to his advancement to regional commander of the army., He also had a rare sense of scientific knowledge and understood the mechanics of fire from an early age so that once he was in a position of authority he undertook to organize a platoon of men who sole responsibility was to fight the common fires which plagued communities built entirely of wood and compacted together so that flames often spread rapidly and destructively. Long before many understood that tar and combustibles could build up in a chimney and lead to fire Florian grasped this concept and to prevent fires he trained his platoon of firefighters to visit homes and businesses and assure that there was minimal buildup in chimneys. He earned guite a reputation for all of these efforts so that after his death firefighters and chimney sweeps would often ask his intercession in their prayers to God.

Like many in that era, Florian was exposed to the evangelization of the Church and found in it an inner peace which led to his conversion. As regional commander, and a Christian, he often overlooked the stringent anti-Christian edicts arriving from Rome. Again as often happens, a busy-body who preferred the old order, wrote to his commander in Rome that Florian was openly flouting the law by refusing to imprison, torture and otherwise persecute the Christian community. A delegation with a detachment of soldiers arrived to undertake an investigation and Florian was found guilty not only of treason (a capitol offense) but of himself being a Christian.

A man who had dedicated much of his life to preventing and stopping destructive fires was sentenced to be burned at the stake. The sentence was not carried out by the soldiery after Florian dared them to light the fire so he could leap on it himself. Instead a millstone was tied to his neck and he was flung into the Enns River in the foothills of the Austrian Alps and drowned. In thanks for his efforts to spare the Christian community his body was recovered and given a Christian burial at Lorch where many came to seek his intercession so that it didn't take long for him to be known as a saint protecting both firefighters and chimney sweeps.

### The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick**: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


