

Dear People of God,

Last week I began a series on the various roles appropriate to the ranks of the faithful. Today I want to do a very quick overview of the sixteen documents of II Vatican Council which include some reference, large or small, to the work of the Synod on Synodality. Keep in mind that *synodality* means walking together on the pilgrim way to the Kingdom, a key phrase included in the three new Eucharistic Prayers promulgated not that long ago as part of the revision of the Roman Missal.

The Second Vatican Council sought the "full and active participation" of the lay faithful in the broader concept of the Church's universal mission to evangelize the peoples of all corners of the globe. You can find this encouraging change in many of the sixteen documents, especially 5 of particular significance: the foundational *Gaudium et spes*, its companion constitution *Lumen gentium*, and the liturgical frameworks etched by the Decree on the Liturgy, the Decree on Evangelization, and the Decree on the role of the laity in the work of the Church among others. Each of those documents directly mentioned the enhanced role the "people in the pew" were to exercise so that everybody in the Church truly walked together toward the Kingdom.

In the document (3rd Decree) on the lay faithful, *Apostolicam actuositatem*, the bishops began their discussion of what is expected of the laity with this introduction:

Our own times require of the laity no less zeal: in fact, modern conditions demand that their apostolate be broadened and intensified. With a constantly increasing population, continual progress in science and technology, and closer interpersonal relationships, the areas for the lay apostolate have been immensely widened particularly in fields that have been for the most part open to the laity alone. These factors have also occasioned new problems which demand their expert attention and study. This apostolate becomes more imperative in view of the fact that many areas of human life have become increasingly autonomous. This is as it should be, but it sometimes involves a degree of departure from the ethical and religious order and a serious danger to Christian life. Besides, in many places where priests are very few or, in some instances, deprived of due freedom for priestly work, the Church could scarcely exist and function without the activity of the laity.

That final sentence provides the urgency for the Synod on Synodality because among the changes the Church has experienced over the past sixty years is the rapidly decreasing number of active priests. By way of demonstration, when I was ordained in 1983 our diocese had just shy of three hundred active priests. Seventeen years later, in 2000, that number had dropped to one hundred and ten and today hovers in the neighborhood of ninety. Over the next decade it will decline even more. The Synod is addressing that problem by looking at the documents of II Vatican Council on the role of the laity and will no doubt offer some of the same recommendations which were made sixty years ago which were intended to grow the role of the non-ordained in the function of the Church's Mission and Ministry. I'll look at some of those as we continue the series.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



When a priest retires, his living expenses actually increase. A retired priest is responsible for his personal expenses such as food, clothing, car, housing and utility costs, and medical expenses. While a priest is active, his housing and food expenses are paid by the parish, school, or diocesan institution to which he is assigned. When he retires, he must provide for his own housing needs, unless he chooses to live in a rectory/parish settina.

It is important to know that, in their generosity, many of our priests designate the Priests' Retirement Fund as a beneficiary of their estate to ensure the care of priests who follow after them. <u>Envelopes can be found in</u> <u>the pews.</u>
