

Dear People of God,

Last week I mentioned the decline in the number of priests, and I want to be clear that the decline is largely restricted to the so-called "First World," the wealthy nations like the US, Europe, and parts of South America. In much of the world where the issues facing the "First World" are less prevalent right now, seminaries are full and ordinations remain high. Let's take a very superficial look at why that might be the case before we go on to look at how the Synod on Synodality may address the problem in terms of activating more involvement by the non-ordained.

The first world has, as Bishop Hoffman warned the four of us being ordained in 1983, "arrived" and does not need God. I don't think any of us reading this letter doubt that. Other 'gods' have become far more attractive in our highly materialistic, technologically-oriented culture. Movie stars, performers, and sports icons have replaced the saints; power, prestige, profit and prominence have become the pilgrim goals of many; addictions to mind-altering drugs or technologies have replaced the worship of God.

Not that long ago most Catholics could easily pull a rosary out of a pocket or purse and meditate on God's intervention in human life. Today the rosary has been replaced by the cellphone and social media. On my return from Ireland, I had a long layover in Washington and watched an entire waiting room sit in near silence staring at the glowing face of a technological god. There was no social interaction at all. Children weren't talking to parents who weren't talking to one another.

When we factor in that families today, for a lot of reasons, are much smaller, there is no longer a pool of young men available for the Spirit to call!

Not that long ago parents watched for the movement of the Spirit and actually fostered vocations. That is no longer the case. I have often heard a parent admit that "I think Johnnie has a real call to priesthood, but, Father, I want grandchildren so I'm discouraging that vocation."

It's also much more difficult for a young person (or an older one) to be accepted for seminary to-day. Over the past few decades, faith formation has seen a serious decline so that many young people, despite twelve years of religious classes, have very little real sense of faith and its spiritual dimension. Pope Francis has lamented this in several of the documents he's issued and suggests this leads to a person altogether failing to hear and respond to the Holy Spirit. On the other side of that coin are the numerous psychological issues impinging on young people. Where depression and suicidal ideation are increasingly common, finding the stable population of young people for formation is increasingly difficult.

Many bishops have attempted to slow the decline in numbers of priests by inviting foreign priests to minister in their dioceses. Unfortunately, many Americans, having forgotten their own immigrant ancestry, are unwelcoming of these able men, citing accents, even skin color as reason enough to go somewhere else. That inhospitable attitude is the external expression of the failure of the Church to adequately empower the laity to their role in a truly universal Church which embraces all. Such behavior should be an embarrassment to all of good faith.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
