Dear People of God,

I've been working on a series looking forward to the Synod on Synodality which will reconvene in Rome this October. Today I'd like to take a look back at the initial effort to empower the laity to assume their rightful role as disciples of Jesus. In the document on the laity, the Council articulated both the rights which ensue from Baptism and the obligations which result from accepting the rights. These were formally adopted in the Code of Canons promulgated by St. John Paul II in 1983 and can be found by calling up the Code on your internet browser and doing a search for rights of the faithful.

In the sunshine days following the Council, bishops and pastors took to heart the document and began to formulate programmatic training for lay ministry. These programs enhanced the knowledge of the Church's theology, its moral position, its liturgical foundations, and its evangelization efforts and missionary programs. Depending on how thorough these various efforts were or how seriously attendees took them, the result was a well-prepared group of men and women who could be tasked to the various ministries anticipated by the documents of the Council.

The idea was to bring about independent working groups in the key areas of (1) liturgical life, (2) Christian formation, (3) family life and spirituality, (4) evangelization, (5) ecumenism and (6) Mission. Those who had availed themselves were expected to recruit a group of men and women who worked together to make those six areas come alive in the parish. At the same time, those who formed the various teams were expected to prepare for its ongoing life by training a successor and, eventually moving on to some other ministry either in the list of six or identified by the Pastoral Council as being needed in the parish.

Where this worked, it was common for people to move around in the ministries every five or six years, often assuming the responsibility for forming one of the new teams envisioned by long range strategic planning. Where this continues to work, it is not at all uncommon to find as many as a hundred commissions and committees functioning together to assure the sustainability and life of the parish.

The goal of all of this was to empower the laity to assume responsibility and undertake the work of the Church "on their own," only deferring to the larger sense of the Pastoral Council in tandem with the pastor. Parish vision statements were expected to provide a lens through which each of the ministries viewed its aspect of parish life and carried out its mandate of discipleship. Where the parish vision was practical and rooted in the Church's own vision of "going out and teaching all nations. . ." parishes thrived, grew and didn't worry about aging or loss of the young to the suburbs. Where the parish vision was vague or embraced idealistic but unattainable ends, or where the people who put it together forgot Jesus' final command, few of the anticipated "new" ministries ever developed and some of the traditional ones languished. To some extent this is also the result of the changing vision of the bishop as the shepherd of the diocese changes and brings some new way to think about Church or see its necessary avenues of growth. Once again, resistance to change gets in the way of the Lord's own work.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
