

Dear People of God,

As we dive deeper into Advent, the period of watchful waiting for the arrival of the Messiah, consider the ordinary “advent” celebration all of us go through each week – at least I hope we do! What I’m thinking of is how we look forward to our regular participation in the arrival of Jesus the Christ into our very being as we receive the Body and Blood of Christ.

Perhaps we don’t think of the Mass as the fulfillment of the promises of God throughout the Old Testament to personally come and rescue his people and dwell with them; however, that is one of the things that Eucharist is about: Jesus, for whom we have waited all week long, comes to the altar and invites us to come forward and partake of his being so that we enter into partnership with the divine. The hope here is that we understand the richness of what that means in terms of our behaviors and actions over the next few days.

If we genuinely believe that what we take in our hands or on our tongue is really God, shouldn’t that get us thinking how to live in that reality? Here are a few thought questions for the weekend: Do we take time to reflect on the dignity to which we have been raised by accepting Jesus into our lives? Not a quick Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be but a sincere effort to allow the divine presence to be felt within our being. Do we transform the way we think about family, work, and leisure because we have taken God himself into our lives? Shouldn’t the presence of God change us so that we’re kinder, more thoughtful of self and others and open to the Spirit moving us forward toward the Kingdom?

If we truly believe in the real presence and come up to the altar to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus, how can we then say hurtful things to anyone? How can we do things that cause harm to God’s creation, especially God’s image and likeness in all other people regardless of who they are or where they come from?

Perhaps if we spent more time in a personal advent, hopeful and watching and preparing for the coming of the Messiah at Mass, we would better grasp the consequences which should follow our “going to communion.” During these closing days of the Advent, why not give it a try? Spend four or five minutes each day anticipating what your encounter with God himself will be like, what it will accomplish and what miracles you can do with God as your faithful partner. You might be surprised at what a difference those four or five minutes can make in who you are, where you go and what you can do for others.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Happenings at the Parish!

Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a *Level 3 Snow Emergency*

during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.
