

Dear People of God,

Ah, it's Christmas! Or is it? Yes, the big box stores have been offering us a myriad of decorations, gifts and what not since late August. Yes, most of us put up a tree weeks ago and lit up the yard with all sorts of lights ( Did you know that yard lights are as ancient as humanity and arose from our fear of the dark? We don't have much fear anymore, but outdoor decorations are a way of regaining the light that has "disappeared" with the seasonal shift of the sun). Yes, most of us have completed our shopping and wrapped the presents. Yet Christmas does not "happen" until December 25, the day Christianity celebrates the birth of Jesus Christ ( Did you know that December 25 is the first day you can tell that there's more light than the day before and Spring is on its way).

For the secular world, where big box stores rely on seasonal sales to shore up annual profits, holidays are anticipated as much as in the Church where Advent is the lead up to Christmas, a time for preparing for the "Big Day." However, for the Church, the arrival of the Holy Day is not the end of the celebration so that we can move on to the next event (heading to NYC for the glittering drop of the New Year's Ball, or Port Clinton for the dropping of the walleye.) Christmas day is only the beginning of the retelling of the first days of Christ's presence among us. As with any of us, Jesus' birth didn't end there but led to other events which for the church conclude with the Baptism of the Lord in the River Jordan.

Christmas is a time of extraordinary generosity: families often spend inordinate amounts of money for gifts for spouse, children, aunts, uncles, parents, bosses, co-workers, the mail man and then forget the Church which is, as the famous saying goes, "the reason for the season." Most parishes count on Christmas as a particularly generous response in part because so many people who otherwise forget their obligations to the Lord show up for Mass, but also because regular donors do more to give thanks for the blessings of Christ's presence. Unfortunately, today the crowds have dwindled as Christmas becomes increasingly about the Grinch and a straggly Charlie Brown Christmas tree than Christ's Mass which is the fundamental celebration we should be observing.

Over these next few days, pause from the shopping, cookie baking and other preparations in your home and take time to prepare the home of Christ in your soul so that your Christmas might be truly blessed, an event which shines forth in your life in the days to come. And why not skip Christmas day TV broadcasts: the NFL game, the NBA Super Extravaganza, and the bowl games. Instead allow Christmas to truly penetrate your day. May Christmas be a time of blessing for you and yours.

### ***The Celebration of Sacraments***

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

**In the event that you are in need of a priest or deacon and there is no one in the office:** Please try the emergency number at 419-243-6031 and leave a message with your phone number and your call will be returned as soon as possible.

## Happenings at the Parish!

### **Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency**

during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.
