

Dear People of God,

With Ordinary Time beginning again, I'm looking at a few ordinary words we use at Mass without giving them much thought, thus perhaps missing the meaning, implication and consequences of saying them if we claim to believe them. Today let's look at a simple phrase: *I believe in one God*. Often God reveals important information by giving us what seems a negative, like *Thou shall not kill* and the others in The Big Ten. To better grasp what *I believe in one God* means, we could look back to how the Old Testament states that truth: *There is one God, there is no other*.

Obviously if there is no other, there can be nothing which rises above that one God in importance or the divine authority we believe is attached to the very notion of God. The implication of that is the behavioral attitude we take: that in the hierarchy of our actions and behaviors, those that favor God always come first which is why we don't kill his image and likeness, tell lies to his image and likeness, cheat his image and likeness. The understanding of image and likeness comes from our belief in the one God who inspired the Old Testament. The consequences of our believing in one God lead to the Great Command found in both the Old and New Testaments: *Love God with your whole heart, your whole soul, your whole mind and with all your strength and love your neighbor as you love yourself*.

Oops! This is getting complicated because if we really believe in one God, we need to get a grasp on the three elemental aspects of who we are as his image and likeness: body (heart), mind and soul. Knowing we have a body is relatively easy. We can see it, we can feel it, we can hear it. We can even communicate with our body via the sixth sensory system we don't think about a whole lot: the somatosensory system which registers pain, the need for a restroom break, the desire for something to eat or drink and other interior communications up to our active mind. Most of us know we have a mind but do we take time to get to know it beyond what it feeds to our consciousness? If getting in touch with the mind is difficult, talking to the soul or listening to it is even more difficult. Nevertheless, that's the challenge given by the Great Command because the love we owe God has those three dimensions as does our love of self and others! All of this means we should be doing a lot more reflection/meditation on the expectations of loving defined by the Church which makes it a little easier to accomplish than working on our own. If you take advantage of Bible Study, Adult Education, and/or FORMED, you'll find a way to better understand what you mean when you say *I believe in one God*.

### ***The Celebration of Sacraments***

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

**In the event that you are in need of a priest or deacon and there is no one in the office:** Please try the emergency number at 419-243-6031 and leave a message with your phone number and your call will be returned as soon as possible.

## Happenings at the Parish!

### Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a **Level 3** **Snow Emergency**

during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.
