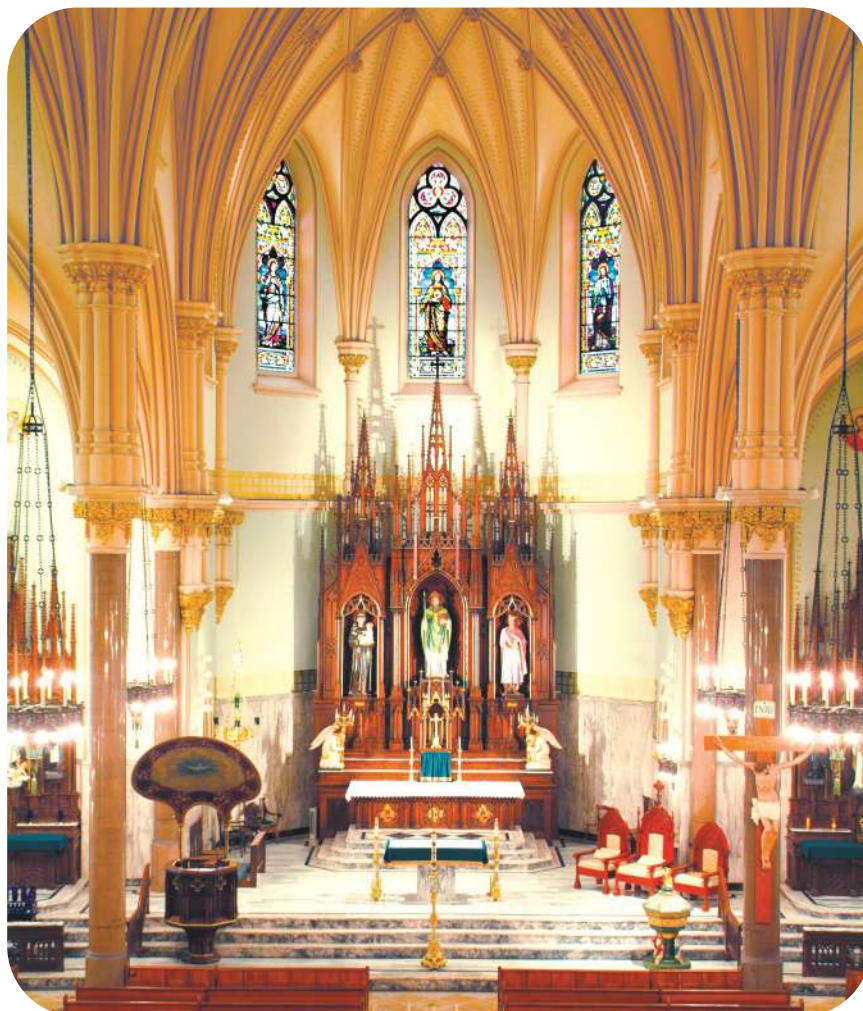

Dear People of God,

This Wednesday the Church celebrates St. Thomas Aquinas, one of the greatest minds ever to address the mysteries of our God and our Church. He was a 13th Century scholastic philosopher which means he was a natural scientist interested in everything because everything was created by God. Thomas taught at both the university of Paris, considered the finest school on earth in his day, and at the Dominican school of theology in Rome which eventually came to be named for him. He produced a huge number of books on all sorts of subjects from proving that God exists to a basic outline of how each of us makes a decision. He wrote several hymns we still use today, including the *Pange Lingua/Tantum Ergo*, *Adoro te Devote* and about forty others. Much of his writing is difficult to understand because he was working at a level so far above the rest of us; this led to his being accused of being a heretic and summoned before a Church Council to defend his writing. He was exonerated and remained a key source of information about things theological for centuries.

Aquinas, like many of the great philosophers of the past, was more or less shoved to the back burner in the twentieth century, replaced by some theologians who were thought to write in a clearer manner but who never attained the depth of knowledge or expertise Thomas had centuries before. Over the past few decades, he has once again attained a central place in the library of great theologians who are referenced time and time again while the so-called “clear writers” have faded into the background.

Thomas enjoyed a good meal and as often happens in situations like that, he gained a lot of weight and his health suffered. This led to his being released from a second term at Paris and establishing a new school at Naples where he had visions of God and Mary; after one of them, it was reported to his secretary that he could no longer write because compared to what he had seen, everything he had written could be summed up as “all is straw.” He was summoned to the Second Council of Lyon which was to address the Great Schism leading to the Catholic and Orthodox Churches. He died on the way. His treatise on why the split occurred and how it should be resolved remains a key document for those working to bring the two great branches of Christendom together.

A look at Thomas Aquinas is always a good idea for anyone who wants to know more about the Church and its teachings. You can find a lot of great resources on the **FORMED** platform. If you’ve never been there, give it a try. **Instructions for access are included in the bulletin today.**

### **The Celebration of Sacraments**

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

## Happenings at the Parish!

### Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a **Level 3 Snow Emergency**

during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.

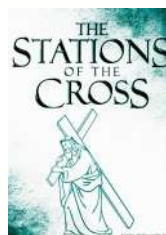
