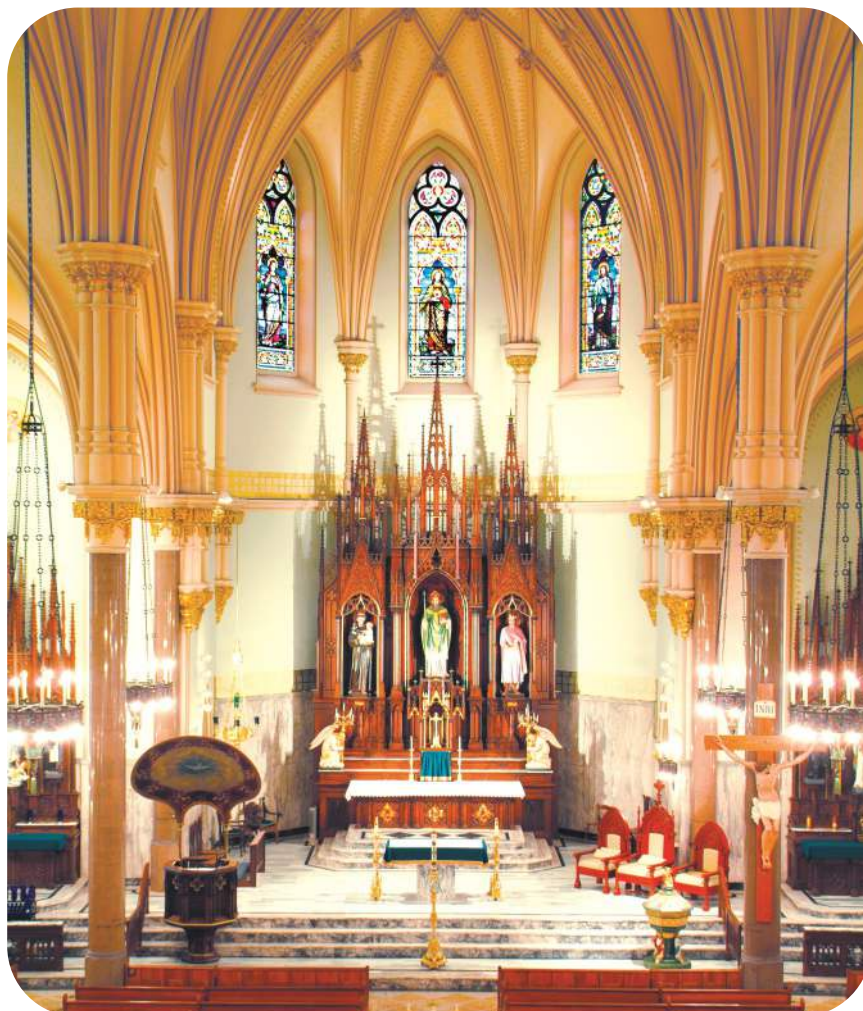

Dear People of God,

Today I offer another example of a series of words we hear every time we gather for Mass but probably allow to pass over our heads without giving them a lot of thought: *"Do this"* They are the words of Jesus to his disciples at the Last Supper. What do they mean? How should our behaviors be affected by them and the consequences of believing them?

We know that *"Do this in remembrance of me"* is part of the words of institution which bring about the true presence of Jesus on the altar so we need to look at what we do (or did since these words are at the end of the consecration). Jesus begins with the words *"Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my body which will be given for you."* He concludes *"do this"* so if we follow logically, then we are to take this, all of us, and eat of it, for this is Jesus body which is given for us.

Note that he doesn't say *"do something like this"* or *"do this in imitation"* or anything but *"do this,"* the same thing he himself did. Again, the logic here places us in the moment of the Last Supper: the bread becomes flesh, the wine becomes blood and we're doing what the disciples did which is to take and eat, take and drink. It's a mystery which confused even some great theologians who abandoned the real presence in favor of the Word alone and continues to confuse many people in the pew. Nevertheless, it's relatively easy to understand if we actually believe in one God. God is almighty, God does what God alone can do, and if God says *"this is my body,"* it is because God said so and among the consequences of believing in one God is that God, being perfect, cannot lie.

Of course, we also have to believe that Jesus is the Son of God, a person in the singularity of God who is Trinity. That's where the problem begins: many people do not believe Jesus is fully God (there was a huge billboard saying just that on Summit Street a month ago) so for them, his words at the Last Supper don't have the obvious meaning they do if he's really God. That makes it easy to roll over in bed Sunday morning and skip Mass because it's just a memorial, not the real thing. Empty pews attest to the fact that many Catholics fall into this category of doubtful members because they'll all be back to claim the free marriage or burial ticket they got at Baptism.

Sadly, far too many Catholics, to say nothing of other Christians, have become distracted by the overwhelming presence of "science" in our world. It seems there's nothing that science can't master or provide for us so that our dependence on God weakens until a disaster hits, causing us to run back to what's been there all along – the natural understanding that yes, there is a God and, yes, that God is for us Catholics, Jesus the Christ.

### **The Celebration of Sacraments**

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

**In the event that you are in need of a priest or deacon and there is no one in the office:** Please try the emergency number at 419-243-6031 and leave a message with your phone number and your call will be returned as soon as possible.

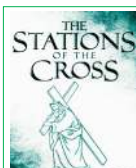
### The 2026 Annual Catholic Appeal
