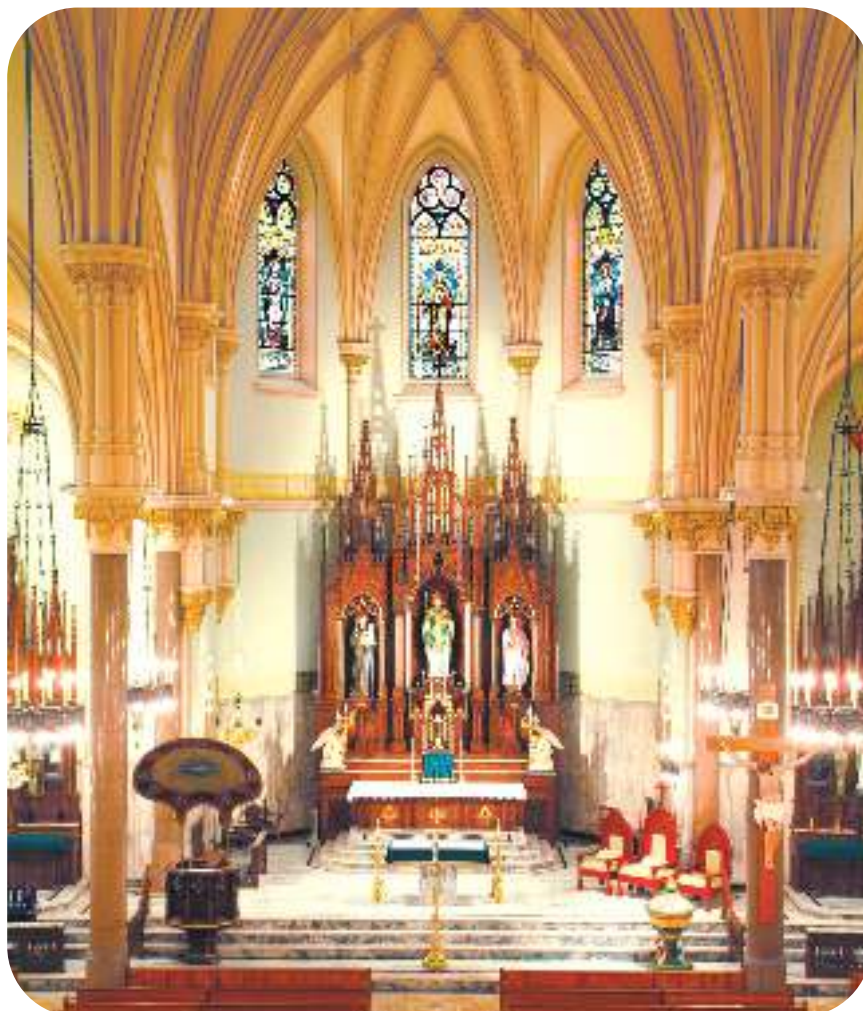

Dear People of God,

This year marks the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence, one of the most amazing documents ever written. Many places will provide a reading of the Declaration as part of their Fourth of July celebrations. Hearing it just the other day at Waite High School which honors the fallen veterans of the high school every Memorial Day inspired these comments on a couple of lines from that amazing piece of writing.

First, I want to address the current notion that the Declaration is not a religious document and the founders who signed it weren't religious men. All of the signers were regular attendees at some Church and felt that their efforts to redress grievances with the King and Parliament of England was a God-ordained necessity. That led to this important inclusion at the very beginning of the Declaration: All Men are endowed by the creator with certain inalienable rights. The use of the term *creator* certainly points to the divine but because the founders understood the broad range of religious practices already present in what would become the United States, they were careful not to make the God of the Declaration apt to only one of those religious traditions. *Inalienable rights* means that nobody can take them away: they are implicit in being a human person and derive from the creator, not government so government can't infringe upon them.

The authors of the Declaration also understood that rights are universals: everybody – young, old, male, female - has them, not just a select few. The terminology making that point reminds the world that when government attempts to restrict those rights, it becomes the obligation of the people to reform the government or separate from it, a key phrase from the Declaration.

The Declaration lists three basic rights which we all have: life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness; for many, that's it. But reread the sentence and you'll quickly discover that there are other inalienable rights not specifically listed. Thirteen years later the Constitutional Congress sought to lay out a few more of those rights in the Constitution by limiting what the government can do. The original amendments to the Constitution, the Bill of Rights, goes even farther to make sure the government knows what it cannot take away from the people.

The Declaration and the Constitution make it clear that as far as the government goes, it is the creature, not the creator: it has no power at all that has not been given to it by the people who can take it away if the government begins to infringe on the rights of those who are the makers of the government.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

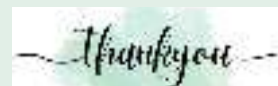
