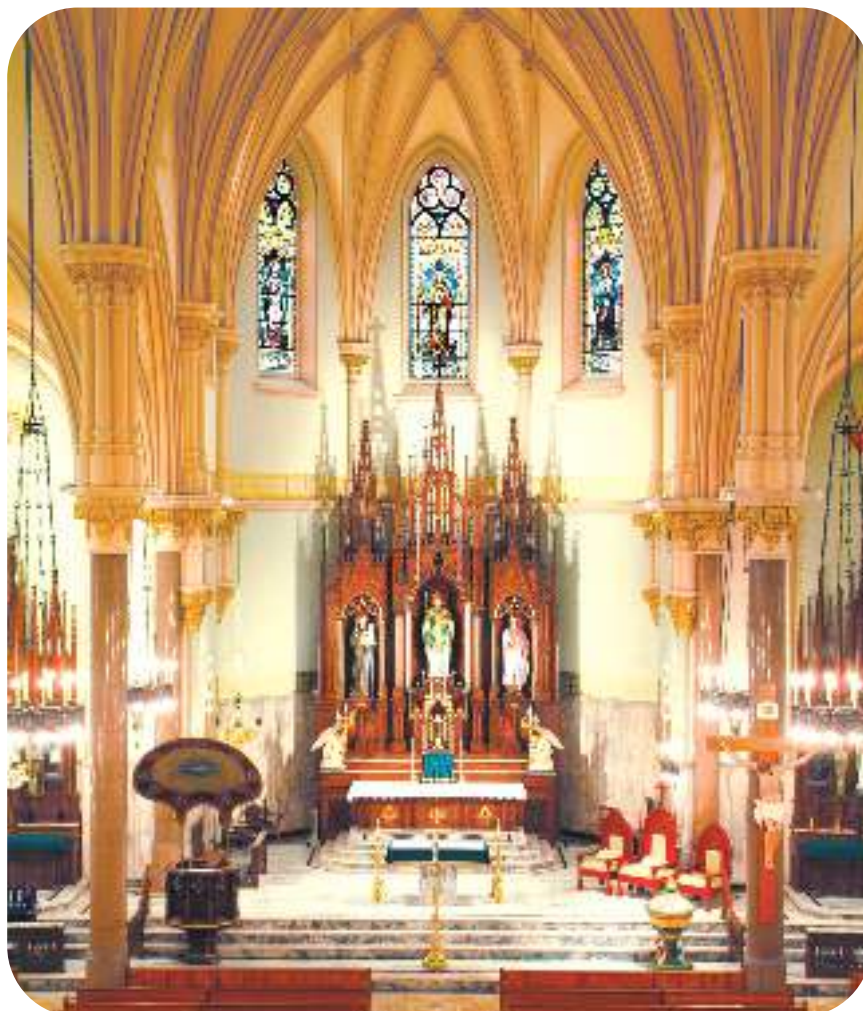

Dear People of God,

A couple of weeks ago I offered one or two letters on groups within the Church that believe that since the time of John XXIII, we have not had a legitimate pope; such groups cite some arcane rumor that after the real election of the cardinal considered the favorite at the time, he was somehow set aside and Cardinal Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was quickly introduced as pope. Known as John XXIII, Roncalli governed the Church for five short years (1958-1963) but his papacy was one of the most profound in the two millennia since Jesus entrusted his Church to Peter. Personable and likeable, he immediately became the favorite of one and all. However, when he summoned the bishops to Rome for an Ecumenical Council in January of 1959, rumblings of discontent began to spread. As the Council undertook to deliberate the very nature of the Church in modern times, one of their goals was to bring to completion the work of the First Vatican Council which was interrupted by the Italian seizure of the papal States and the occupation of Rome. That first meeting of bishops had hoped to provide a clearly laid out constitution of the Church. Two documents were promulgated: *Dei Filius* and *Pastor Aeternus*.

In the Dogmatic Constitution on the Catholic Faith, *Dei Filius*, the council condemned what it considered the errors of [rationalism](#), [anarchism](#), [communism](#), [socialism](#), [liberalism](#), [materialism](#), [modernism](#), [naturalism](#), [pantheism](#), and [secularism](#). Work on the second document, *Pastor Aeternus*, which was to outline the nature and function of the Church, never got around to completing its work after issuing a preliminary statement on the infallibility of the pope when he speaks/teaches "ex cathedra" or from the position as Vicar of Christ on issues of faith and morality.

You can find these two documents on the Vatican web page. Vatican II issued two documents, *Gaudium et spes* and *Lumen gentium* which completed the work of Vatican I.

The Council then went on to deliberate other important documents, many of which were not well accepted by a few reactionary bishops, among them Marcel LeFevre who thought the Council had gone too far in streamlining the Church. Against the will of some 2500 bishops, he announced that the Council was illegitimate and established a counter church which opposed just about everything that the Second Vatican Council accomplished. That action led to excommunication, a term which means leaving the body of the faithful. Attempts were made to reconcile the movement but tensions remained which led to the consecration on 1 July this year of six bishops without the required mandate of the Holy Father. Pope Leo warned the Society of St. Pius X (Lefevre's movement) that this would lead to another excommunication but that did not phase the Society. We will no doubt be hearing a lot about the split this has caused (called a schism) but I am reminded that disobedience was the sin of Adam and it is still the problem of many.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Christ Child Society of Toledo is looking for women to join its organization. Christ Child is dedicated to serving the needs of underserved children and youth—for the love of the Christ Child.

Christ Child is an all-volunteer organization with more than 200 local members who donate over 15,000 hours annually. Christ Child's largest program is **Cloth-a-Child** where 2,000 new coats, hats, gloves, and books are purchased each year and then distributed to children from birth through 8th grade. Through the Layette Program, more than 1,600 layette/newborn care packages are distributed to underserved new moms in the fall and spring.

Christ Child volunteers tutor and offer library assistance at Rosary Cathedral, Gesu, Queen of Apostles School, and Hope Learning Academy. Volunteers also teach classes for new and expectant parents at several local service agencies and assist with other programs including Angle Layettes and Theatre Vision.

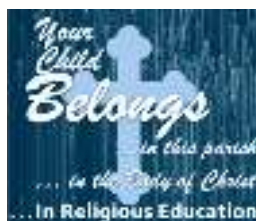
